

## State of South Dakota Office of the Governor

Whereas, general aviation and community airports play a critical role in the lives of our citizens, as well as in the operation of our businesses and farms; and

Whereas, the state of South Dakota has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aerospace, aircraft manufacturing, educational institutions, aviation organizations, community airports and airport operators; and

Whereas, according to the South Dakota State Aviation System Plan 2010-2030, the aviation industry supports over \$791 million in state business sales; and

Whereas, according to the South Dakota Office of Aeronautics, South Dakota is home to 71 public-use general aviation airports. According to the FAA, these airports serve 2333 pilots and 2030 active general aviation aircraft across the state; and

Whereas, according to the South Dakota State Aviation System Plan, the aviation industry in South Dakota supports over 7,000 jobs with an annual income of \$250 million. Agricultural aviation supports more than \$10 million of income in the state, according to the same study; and

Whereas, according to FAA data, South Dakota is home to 15 repair stations, 3 FAA-approved pilot schools, 526 student pilots and 435 flight instructors. In addition, there are 42 fixed-base operators in the state, according to the AC-U-KWIK directory. According to Helicopter Association International, there are 38 heliports in South Dakota; and

Whereas, many communities in South Dakota depend heavily on general aviation and community airports for the continued flow of commerce, tourists and visitors to our state; and

Whereas, the nation's aviation infrastructure represents an important public benefit;

Now, Therefore, I, Dennis Daugaard, Governor of the state of South Dakota, do hereby proclaim June 2018, as
