

A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's 132 public use airports provide reliable access to regional and world markets for businesses and their cargo; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin airports carried over 94 million pounds of cargo in 2009; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin is also home to 148 heliports, including those used by hospitals; and

WHEREAS, studies have shown that 85% of new or expanded manufacturers in the state located within 15 miles of a jet capable airport; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's Department of Transportation has demonstrated that aviation and airports generate almost \$3 billion in economic activity and support more than 41,000 jobs, which provide over \$1 billion in personal income to Wisconsin residents; and

WHEREAS, aviation in Wisconsin accommodated over 5.7 million passengers in 2009; and


