jobs across the state; and,

Whereas, Hagerstown is proud to be home to the Hagerstown Regional Airport.

In 1928, Kreider-Reisner purchased 60 acres of the farm owned by Robert and Emma Brumbaugh which became home to the City of Hagerstown Airport. The property, now known as Hagerstown Regional Airport, is located approximately three miles north of Hagerstown has grown in size over the years. It is among the oldest

continuously operating U.S. airports in history; and,
