## **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS, the city of Mankato in the state of Minnesota has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aircraft manufacturing, aviation educational institutions, aviation organizations and community airports; and

WHEREAS, general aviation and the Mankato Regional Airport have significant economic impact on the city of Mankato; including more than \$11 million in local economic impact and more than 164 jobs; and

WHEREAS, through a partnership, Minnesota State University, Mankato—the only four-year aviation degree program in Minnesota—trains approximately 300 active flight students at the Mankato Regional Airport annually. This number is up around 28 percent due to a surge in job market.

WHEREAS, the more than \$11 million in local economic impact includes airport ownership, fixed-base operators and other aviation businesses, retail business, overnight use by pilots and other visitors, business use and non-profit or government entities; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota is home to 135 public-use airports, which serve around 12,483 pilots and 5,679 active general aviation aircraft, 111 fixed-based operators, 50 repair stations, 83 heliports; and

WHEREAS, general aviation in Minnesota contributes over \$5.3 billion to the state's economy annually; and it improves overall quality of life by supporting emergency medical and healthcare services, public safety, disaster relief, and by transporting business travelers to their destinations quickly and safely; and

WHEREAS, the nation's aviation infrastructure represents an important public benefit, and Congressional oversight should be in place to ensure stable funding of this system;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Eric Anderson, Mayor of Mankato, do hereby proclaim general aviation a vital strategic resource to the city of Mankato and declare November 2018 as "General Aviation Appreciation Month," in the city of Mankato, Minnesota.
