According to the 2022 Indiana State Aviation Economic Impact Study, the total annual economic impact of general aviation airports to Indiana's economy is more than \$1.4 billion.

Aviation by the Numbers

According to FAA data, Indiana is home to 95 public-use general aviation airports, 15,876 pilots, and 5,640 registered aircraft.

Number of Jobs

According to the 2022 Indiana State Aviation Economic Impact Study, general aviation airports in Indiana support over 11,000 jobs and sustain a payroll of more than \$548 million.

Economic Impact

The same study estimates that the total annual economic impact of general aviation airports to Indiana's economy is more than \$1.4 billion.

According to FAA data, Indiana is home to 55 repair stations, 24 FAA-approved pilot schools, 6,985 student pilots, and 2,476 flight instructors.

There are 76 fixed-base operators in the state, according to the AC-U-KWIK directory.

According to the University Aviation Association, flight departments in Indiana include Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana Wesleyan University in Marion, Ivy Tech Community College in Indianapolis, Purdue University in West Lafayette, and Vincennes University in Vincennes.
