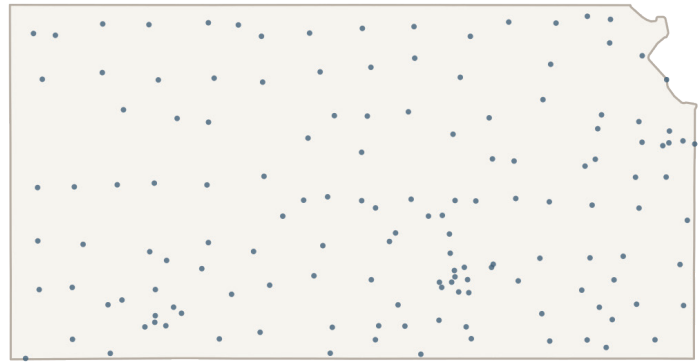


# KANSAS

*According to the Economic Contribution of Kansas Airports —2022 Study, airports in Kansas support more than \$11 billion in economic activity annually.*

## *Aviation by the Numbers*

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, Kansas has 148 public airports. According to FAA data, Kansas is home to 9,240 pilots, and 5,685 registered aircraft.



## *Number of Jobs*

According to the Economic Contribution of Kansas Airports—2022 Study, airports in Kansas support over 34,000 jobs and an overall payroll of about \$2.3 billion.

## *Economic Impact*

According to the same study, airports in Kansas support more than \$11 billion in economic activity annually.

According to FAA data, Kansas is home to 94 repair stations, 9 FAA-approved pilot schools, 3,717 student pilots, and 1,528 flight instructors.

In addition, there are 87 fixed-base operators in the state registered in the AC-U-KWIK database.

According to the University Aviation Association, flight departments in Kansas include Central Christian College of Kansas in McPherson, Fort Hays State University in Hays, Hesston College Aviation in Hesston, Kansas State University in Salina, and Wichita State University in Wichita.

## *Advanced Air Mobility*

Kansas' Advanced Air Mobility Strategy projects that AAM could generate between \$10.73 billion and \$34.09 billion in cumulative GDP, \$20.31 billion to \$63.72 billion in gross output, \$8.42 billion to \$26.99 billion in personal income, and roughly 40,700 to 122,100 jobs in the state by 2050.
