Aviation by the Numbers

According to FAA data, New Hampshire is home to 21 public-use general aviation airports, 4,976 pilots, and 1,566 registered aircraft.

Number of Jobs

According to the PwC study, Contribution of General Aviation to the US Economy in 2023, general aviation in New Hampshire supports 6,600 jobs in the state, resulting in \$643 million in labor income.

Economic Impact

According to the same study, the economic output of general aviation in New Hampshire is more than \$1.6 billion annually.

According to FAA data, New Hampshire is home to 20 repair stations, 1 FAA-approved pilot school, 1,785 student pilots, and 980 flight instructors.
