

WYOMING

According to the 2020 WYDOT Aeronautics Division Aviation Economic Impact Study, general aviation airports in the state contribute over \$115 million in economic impact annually.

Aviation by the Numbers

According to FAA data, Wyoming is home to 33 public-use general aviation airports, 2,892 pilots, and 3,220 registered aircraft.

Number of Jobs

According to the 2020 WYDOT Aeronautics Division Aviation Economic Impact Study, general aviation airports in Wyoming support over 1,600 jobs and a total payroll of over \$57.8 million.



Economic Impact

The same study found that general aviation airports in Wyoming support over \$115 million in economic impact annually.

According to FAA data, Wyoming is home to 8 repair stations, 3 FAA-approved pilot schools, 1,286 student pilots, and 398 flight instructors.

In addition, there are 35 fixed-base operators in Wyoming, according to the AC-U-KWIK directory.

According to the University Aviation Association, there is a flight department at Casper College in Casper.
